Someone asked me about you today, and it's been so long since anyone has done that. It felt so good to talk about you...To share my memories of you...To simply say your name out loud. She asked me if I minded talking about what had happened to you...or would it be too painful to speak of it. I told her I think of it every day, and speaking about it helps me to release the tormented thoughts whirling around in my head. She said she never realized the pain would last this long...and apologized for not asking sooner. I told her, "Thanks for asking."I don't know if it was curiosity or concern that made her ask, but I told her, "Please, do it again...sometime soon."

Welcome

I'm standing before a door: beyond it The Meeting takes place. My hands are trembling. I'm very scared and there are tears starting to well up in my eyes. Through the door I can hear voices, even laughter. This can't be the right room! Do they really know my pain? That's what I've been told. I will never again be able to laugh like them. Please give me the strength to do this. We sit together and each person gives an account of what has brought them here. There is so much pain I can barely speak through my emotions. Yet, they all listen and as the meeting ends someone touches my hand. I'm at the door again. Please give me the strength to go through. As I take my seat I see familiar faces. They smile and I try to smile back. Do they know how hard this is for me? Was it ever them? There are so many sad stories. Maybe they do feel my pain! I shed more tears. This time I'm able to ask a few questions through muffled sobs. Still, they all listen and as the meeting ends, someone touches my hand. I've prayed for strength many times as I've entered this room. Each time, as stories are shared, I realize they do know my pain. I feel stronger now so I can share without crying. I realize that all along they were easing their own pain by helping me through mine. A new person comes through the door and takes the seat next to me. The newcomer sheds many tears as attempts are made to talk through muffled sobs. We all listen and as the meeting ends and I touch a hand.

A Note to the Newly Bereaved (and a reminder to the rest of us) By Sascha

The first months and years after bereavement can be terrifying. It seems as if the pain stays at a monotonous peak; it seems as if one's mind will be lost at any moment. And although most of us "get better" after the first terror, we usually do not realize that until we look back, years later. When we think about it, this state of affairs is almost "reasonable". After such an overwhelmingly traumatic experience, we can fall – as it were – to the end of the world. Coming back from there is bound to be slow beyond our imagination and fraught with reversals. So far, no one has found a method to avoid this painful journey back. But perhaps it will help to know you have already begun to travel. You will find it is a long journey and desperately hard and you may almost want to stay where you are. But you will realize later that the wind of tomorrow is already stretching your sails, and life awaits for you across the sea. If you only knew...
